
### Data sharing activity

Data sharing activity continues to grow, with a continuing trend of requests being made under the DATA Scheme, rather than as general requests.

**5 DATA Scheme sharing requests** were made over 1 May to 8 August 2025.

- > 3 of the requests were first time requests by large Australian Government and state government agencies.
- The remaining 2 requests were made by a university and an Australian Government department with previous experience using the Scheme.

The recent requests are for broad-ranging data from health to taxation to inform government policy and programs and conduct research and development for public benefit.



### Commencement of Code amendment

An amendment to the Data Availability and Transparency Code 2022 commenced on 20 June 2025, applying to agreements entered into, or varied, from 1 July 2025. The Code amendment expressly recognises the rights and obligations of State and Territory bodies when sharing data through Commonwealth bodies into DATA Scheme projects.

This is another action completed from the DATA Scheme Working Group.



## DATA Scheme participation

### From 1 May to 8 August 2025:

- 3 new data users were accredited: University of Technology Sydney, Queensland University of Technology and NSW Department of Communities and Justice.
- I new data service provider was accredited: Department of Employment and Workplace Relations.
- Accreditation for 5 data service providers was renewed: the
   Australian Institute of Family Studies, the Department of Social
   Services, Queensland Health, Queensland Treasury and the
   Victorian Department of Health. Together with the Australian
   Institute of Health and Welfare and the Australian Bureau of
   Statistics, these accredited entities can continue to de-identify,
   integrate and provide secure access to Commonwealth data post
   31 July 2025.
- As at 8 August there are 34 Accredited Users and 14 Accredited Data Service Providers (see next slide).
